Edison is brown with darker stripes along the ridge of his back and face.


He has golden eyes and a rectangular pupil.

Did you know that Oberhasli goats can have different coat colors? Just like you and your friends may have different hair colors, these goats range from lighter tan to deep reddish brown. The reddish brown color is thought to be the most desirable color. Rarely, and due to a gene mutation, some males can be born entirely black!



Oberhasli goats were initially called Swiss Alpines. Males can grow to be 34 inches tall and weigh 150 lbs while females will grow to be about 32 inches tall and weigh about 120 lbs. They are considered a large breed goat.










## **DISCUSSION QUESTION...**
